

PASTOR'S CORNER by Father Aaron Williams

On February 22, the Church celebrates the **Feast of the Chair of St. Peter**. It brings to mind the mission of teacher and pastor conferred

by Christ on Peter and continued in an unbroken line down to the present Pope. We celebrate the unity of the Church, founded upon the Apostle, and renew our assent to the Magisterium of the Roman Pontiff, extended both to truths which are solemnly defined *ex cathedra* and to all the acts of the ordinary Magisterium.



The Feast of the Chair of Saint Peter at Rome has been celebrated from the early days of the Christian era on January 18, in commemoration of the day when Saint Peter held his first service in Rome. The feast of the Chair of Saint Peter at Antioch, commemorating his foundation of the See of Antioch, has also been long celebrated at Rome, on February 22. At each place a chair (*cathedra*) was venerated which the Apostle had used while presiding at Mass. One of the chairs is referred to about 600 by an Abbot Johannes who had been commissioned by Pope Gregory the Great to collect in oil from the lamps which burned at the graves of the Roman martyrs.



Abstinence: Catholics abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday (March 5, 2025), Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. Abstinence binds all Catholic age 14 years and older.



Fast: Catholics fast (eating only one full meal) on Ash Wednesday (March 5, 2025) and Good Friday (April 18, 2025). Catholics 18-59 years old are bound by this obligation.

Everyone outside the obligatory ages for Fasting and Abstinence is still encouraged to join in on the fun of fasting and abstaining from meat throughout the Lenten season.



The Stations of the Cross is a prayer service consisting of a series of images depicting Jesus Christ on the day of his crucifixion and accompanying prayers.

During Lent, St. Mary Basilica will pray the Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 5:15 p.m. Assumption will pray the Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 5:30 p.m.

On Ash Wednesday, <u>March 5, 2025</u>, we begin Lent, a season that lasts until Easter. The obligation on Ash Wednesday is abstaining from meat and fasting, which means only one full meal through the day. You can also have two smaller meals for keeping up strength, but those two meals combined must still be smaller than the full meal. See Canon Law #'s 1249-1251 for more information. There is <u>NO OBLIGATION</u> to attend Holy Mass and/or receive ashes. [Ash Wednesday has never been a Holy Day of Obligation.]



SAVE THE DATE: SUNDAY, MARCH 16, 2025



The corner stone of the Catholic Church, about to be erected in this city, on the corner of Main and Union streets, was laid yesterday afternoon, at four o'clock, in the presence of a concourse of about two thousand persons. The imposing ceremonies were performed by Right Rev. Dr. J. J. Chanche, assisted by Rev. Mr. Francois and Rev. Mr. Desgaultier.

The Bishop delivered an eloquent address, alluding in appropriate terms to the length of time that had elapsed since their flock had had a temple in which to serve the God of their fathers. He closed with a very excellent exhortation to Christians, not only of his church but of all denominations,

to live in peace and charity with themselves and each other — paying a high compliment at the same time to the Protestants of the city, for the flattering reception which he had met with.
